History at Filey

Intent

At Filey we aim for pupils to gain an understanding and coherent knowledge of Britain's past and that of the wider world, stimulating pupils' curiosity. We aim to enable children to ask questions, think critically and develop perspective and judgement. The history curriculum at Filey makes full use of resources within the immediate and wider local area enabling children to develop a deep understanding of the rich history of our local community. Cross-curricular outcomes in history are specifically planned for, with strong links between the history curriculum and literacy lessons enabling further contextual learning.

Implementation

History is taught as a half termly topic focusing on the skills and knowledge stated in the National curriculum. Teachers identify the key knowledge and skills within each topic, children are able to draw comparisons and make connections between different times and their own lives. Outcomes of work are regularly monitored to ensure they reflect a sound understanding of key identified knowledge. Within EYFS our aim is for children to have an understanding of the world around them; people and communities and technology by the end of the year.

Impact

At Filey we strive for children to know more, remember more and understand more about history. We want children to understand and use the key skills of understanding key events in the past, including historical interpretations, historical enquiry, organisation and communication.
