Which stories are special and why? • talk about some religious stories • recognise some religious words, e.g. about God • identify some of their own feelings in the stories they hear • identify a sacred text e.g. Bible, Qur'an • talk about what Jesus teaches about keeping promises and say why keeping promises is a good thing to do. • talk about what Jesus teaches about saying 'thank you', and why it is good to thank and be thanked.	 Who is a Christian and what do they believe? Talk about some simple ideas about Christian beliefs about God and Jesus Re-tell a story that shows what Christians might think about God, in words, drama and pictures, suggesting what it means. E.g. The Creation Story, The Good Samaritan, Noah's Ark etc. Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories Ask some questions about believing in God and offer some ideas of their own Make links between what Jesus taught and what Christians believe and do. Respond thoughtfully to a piece of Christian music and a Bible text that inspired it. Identify some similarities and differences between the ceremonies studied. 	 Who is a Muslim and what do they believe? Talk about some simple ideas about Muslim beliefs about God, making links with some of the 99 Names of Allah. Re-tell a story about the life of the Prophet Muhammad. Recognise some objects used by Muslims and suggest why they are important. Identify some ways Muslims mark Ramadan and celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr and how this might make them feel. Make links between what the Holy Qur'an says and how Muslims behave. Ask some questions about God that are hard to answer and offer some ideas of their own. What can we learn from sacred books? Recognise that sacred texts contain stories which are special to many people and should be treated with respect. Re-tell stories from the Christian Bible and stories from the Quran; suggest the meaning of these stories. Ask and suggest answers to questions arising from stories Jesus told and from other religions. Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories. Suggest their own ideas about stories from sacred texts and give reasons for their significance. Make links between the messages within sacred texts and the way people live.

 Where do we belong? re-tell religious stories making connections with personal experiences share and record occasions when things have happened in their lives that made them feel special recall simply what happens at a traditional Christian infant baptism and dedication recall simply what happens when a baby is welcomed into a religion other than Christianity. 	 What does it mean to belong to a Faith community? Recognise and name some symbols of belonging from their own experience, for Christians and Muslims, suggesting what these might mean and why they matter to believers. Give an account of what happens at a traditional Christian infant baptism /dedication and suggest what the actions and symbols mean. Identify ways in which people show they are committed to each other when they get married. Respond to examples of co-operation between different people. Give examples of ways in which believers express their identity and belonging within faith communities, responding sensitively to differences. 	
	 How should we care for others and the world, and why does it matter? Re-tell Bible stories and stories from another faith about caring for others and the world. Identify ways that some people make a response to God by caring for others and the. Talk about some texts from different religions that promote the 'Golden Rule', and think about what would happen if people followed this idea more. 	

 Give examples of ways in which believers put their beliefs about others and the world into action, making links with religious stories. Answer the question 'how should we care for others & the world and why does it matter?' thoughtfully, in the light of their learning.

Which places are special and why? • talk about somewhere that is special to themselves, saying why • be aware that some religious people have places which have special meaning for them • talk about the things that are special and valued in a place of worship • identify some significant features of sacred places • recognise a place of worship • Get to know and use appropriate words to talk about their thoughts and feelings when visiting a church.	 What make some places sacred? Identify special objects and symbols found in a place where people worship and be able to say something about what they mean and how they are used. Talk about ways in which stories, objects, symbols and actions used in churches & mosques show what people believe. Describe some of the ways in which people use music in worship, and talk about how different kinds of music makes them feel. Ask good questions during a school visit about what happens in a church or mosque. Suggest meanings to religious songs, responding sensitively to ideas about thanking and praising. Show that they have begun to be aware that some people regularly worship God in different ways and in different places. 	How and why do we celebrate special and sacred times? Identify some ways Christians celebrate Christmas/Easter/Harvest/Pentecost and some ways a festival is celebrated in another religion. Re-tell stories connected with Christmas/Easter/Harvest/Pentecost. and a festival in another religion and say why these are important to believers. Ask questions and suggest answers about stories to do with Christian festivals and a story from a festival in another religion. Collect examples of what people do, give, sing, remember or think about at the religious celebrations studied, and say why they matter to believers.

Understanding Christianity: Incarnation F2 Key Question - Why do Christians perform nativity plays at Christmas? • Be aware that Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem. • Get to know how The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (For example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke).	Understanding Christianity: God 1.1 Key Question - What do Christians believe God is like? • Recognise that Christians believe in God and they find out about God in the Bible. • Be aware that Christians believe that God is loving, kind, fair and also lord and king. Re- tell some stories that show this. • Recognise that Christians worship God and try to live in ways that please him.	 Understanding Christianity: Incarnation 1.3 Key Question - Why does Christmas matter to Christians? Recognise that Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem. Talk about how the Bible points out Jesus' birth shows he was extraordinary and that he came to bring good news. Get to know how Christians celebrate Jesus' birth and know that Advent is a time for Christians to get ready for Jesus coming.

 Be aware that Christians celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus' coming.

Understanding Christianity: Creation F1 Key Question -Why is the word God so important to Christians?

- Recognise that the word God is a name.
- Be aware that Christians believe that God is the creator of the universe
- Be aware that Christians believe that God made out wonderful world so we should look after it.

Understanding Christianity: Salvation F3 Key Questions - Why is Easter special to Christians? Why do Christians put a cross in an Easter garden?

- Talk about how Christians remember Jesus in the last week of Easter.
- Recognise that Jesus' name means he saves.

Understanding Christianity: Creation

- 1.2 Key Question Who do Christians say made the world?
 - Recognise that Christians believe that God created the universe and that the earth and everything in it are important to God.
 - Recognise that God has a unique relationship with human beings as their creator and sustainer.
 - Talk about how and why humans should care for the world because it belongs to God.

Understanding Christianity: Salvation

- 1.5 Key Question Why does Easter matter to Christians?
 - Recognise that Easter is very important in the big story of the Bible. Jesus showed that he was willing to forgive all people.
 - Be aware that Christians believe Jesus builds a bridge between God and humans.
 - Talk about how and why Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead giving people hope of a new life.

Understanding Christianity: Gospel 1.4 Key Question - What is the 'good news' Christians believe Jesus brings?

- Talk about why Christians believe Jesus brings good news for all people.
- Recognise that for Christians, this good news includes being loved by God, and being forgiven for bad things.
- Talk about how and why Christians believe Jesus' teachings make people think hard about how they live and show them the right way.

 Be aware that Christians believe that Jesus came to show Gods love. Christians try to show love to others. 	
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
