Reading at Filey

Intent

Reading at Filey CE Nursery and Infants Academy is integral to a child's understanding and appreciation of the world around them; a platform that allows children to see beyond what they know, share in cultural experiences and develop the vocabulary they need to effectively express themselves. We believe that reading is key to academic success and encourage all children to become lifelong readers with a passion for reading a variety of genres.

Implementation

- Daily phonics sessions are delivered in FS2 and Year 1.
- Children in Year 2 continue to have daily phonics sessions where needed.
- Children needing additional practice in sound recognition and word reading are quickly identified and given the required support.
- Children in FS2 have a daily guided reading session to ensure they have a strong start in reading.
- Children in Y1 and Y2 have guided reading sessions three times a week.
- Children needing additional reading practice read daily.
- Children have a home reading record which they are encouraged to share with parents
- Children in Y1 and Y2 have a Reading Journal which they use to respond to texts during reading sessions.
- Children will be given opportunities to develop speaking and listening, and comprehension skills through whole class guided reading sessions and listening to quality texts read to them.

Impact

Children's reading records, reading journals and tapestry posts will show evidence of children reading a variety of genres. Children will use effective strategies to decode words.

Children will, wherever possible, make at least expected progress in their reading. Parents and Carers will have a good understanding of how they can support and celebrate reading at home. Our aim is for children to leave our school with a passion for reading that stays with them into adult life.
