Reception News

This week in reception, the children have been enjoying the book 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson. They have been creating their own Superworm characters and thinking of ways to describe them. In Art the children have been exploring the artist Kandinsky and have created their own artwork using pastels and paint. In phonics, the children have continued to use their knowledge of phase 2 and 3 sounds to help them read longer words. In maths, the children have been learning about number 10 and exploring the different ways that 10 can be made.

It has been an exciting week. On Tuesday we held our Gymnastics Display. All the children tried really hard and we were very proud of them. On Friday the children had a fantastic time celebrating Red Nose Day.

Year One News

Thank you to all of those who were able to attend the children's gymnastics presentations this week. Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed the presentation and impressed us with their gymnast skills. In Literacy we have been continuing to write the story of the Gingerbread Man. In Maths we have been exploring addition through first, then and now stories. In DT we have started to explore current toy cars and designed our own toy car. In RE we read the parable of 'The good Samaritan' and discussed what we can do to be good neighbours.

Year Two News

This week Year 2 have been enjoying sharing the story, 'The Night Gardener.' They have done some descriptive writing to describe scenes from the story. In maths they have been exploring statistics and have represented data using tally charts, block diagrams and pictograms. During their science lesson they investigated which is the best material for a shopping bag, thinking about suitable and unsuitable properties. In PSHE they learned about healthy eating and sorted different foods according to their food group. In geography they used maps to find out which countries have hot and cold climates. In art they were architects and designed a model house inspired by houses from 1666 before the Great Fire of London. They all enjoyed taking part in the gymnastics celebration this week.
