Reception News

This week the children have been reading the story 'The Paper Dolls'. In Maths they have continued exploring number bonds within 10 and have begun to recall some of these number facts. In Art we have been looking at the artwork of Kandinsky and started creating our own artwork inspired by 'squares with concentric circles'. We have also enjoyed red nose day activities today.

Year One News

In Literacy we have completed writing the story of The Gingerbread Man. In maths we have been exploring addition through first, then, now stories. In RE we read the parable of 'The Good Samaritan' and discussed what we can do to be good neighbours. In DT we have continued making our own toy cars and in History we have been looking at toys through time comparing past and present day toys.

Year Two News

This week Year 2 have been writing Haiku Poetry in their literacy lessons based on the book 'The Story orchestra'. In Maths, they have started looking at fractions. In Art, they have designed and built their own 3D models of the houses that would have been found in 1666 London, linked to their history topic 'The Great Fire of London'. In computing, they finished their Stop Motion animations and have evaluated their work with their partners. In RE, Year 2 has been learning about Easter.
