This week in Nursery we have been thinking about the sound v as in volcano, vet and van. We have been looking at numerals and counting bugs into pots. The role play is a vets and the children have been caring for the sick animals by being kind and gentle. We have also planted broad bean seeds and tomatoes.



Reception News

Reception have had an exciting week this week observing our sunflowers grow. In Maths we have been continuing our learning of 3D shapes including naming, identifying features and following instructions with prepositions. In Literacy we have been reading the story 'Oliver's vegetables' and started to think about what fruit and vegetables we would like to plant in our class allotment. In PSHE we have been thinking about healthy and unhealthy foods and sorting into groups. In RE we have been thinking about places that are special to us and what we like to do in them.

Year One News

This week year 1 has been planning and writing animal riddle poems in literacy using adjectives and verbs. In our maths lessons we have been exploring the inverse relationship of addition and subtraction and practicing our numbers bonds to 10. In science we continued our learning about animals by thinking about different animal diets using the vocabulary carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. In art we learnt about the technique of printing, having a go at printing with everyday objects and creating a design for our own printing blocks. In RE we revisited the Christian story of creation and learnt about Christians belief in God as the creator and sustainer. In Geography we started a new topic all about Kenya.

Year Two News

This week, Year 2 has been focusing on world changers such as Emmeline Pankhurst, Nelson Mandela and Stephen Hawking in their History lessons. During their Literacy lessons, they have written fact files about them. In Maths, they have been learning to tell the time. In Science, they have been looking at seeds and bulbs and have started an experiment to see what plants need to grow. In computing, they have continued to learn about algorithms and in Music they have listened to music by Stevie Wonder. On Wednesday, they celebrated Earth Day and thought about ways to protect our planet!
